1. Describe your project and its purpose (approximately 200 words)?

UBCC350 is coordinating the Vancouver Climate Risk Forum, Friday December 5th @ The Harbour Centre (downtown) with Evening Keynotes at SFU's Gold Corp. Centre for the Arts (downtown)

The event will provide an opportunity for attendees (largely financial professionals, labour reps, elected officials and financial decision makers) to discover and discuss climate risks and fossil fuel divestment.

The program consists of speakers in the morning, roundtable discussions in the afternoon with Keynote Speakers in the evening (open to the public). Confirmed speakers thus far: Mike McGinn (former Mayor of Seattle), Andrea Reimer (Vancouver City Council), Marc Lee (CCPA), Tzeporah Berman (activist-author), Brett Fleishmann (350.org) Andrew Gage (West Coast Law), Christie Stephenson (NEI investments), Karen Lockridge, Monika Freeman (CERES), Vanessa Timmer (One Earth)

2. Outline how your project pertains to the environment and sustainability at UBC (approximately 200 words)?

This project pertains to the environment and sustainability at UBC because we have extended the invitation to the UBC Board of Governors hoping that some members of the Board will attend the event and leave the forum well versed on divestment and the financial risks associated with fossil fuel holdings. This event can lead to sustainable action taken by the BOG to reduce the carbon footprint of UBC's endowment fund that's currently 9X larger than our carbon foot-print on campus. UBC is in the perfect position to be one of the first major Universities to divest from fossil fuels, and the first one in Canada if they pursue this initiative that students, faculty, TA unions and staff labour unions have voiced their support for.

UBC should align its investments with its values and emphasis on sustainable living by divesting from fossil fuels.

Are you pursuing any other sources of funding? If so, what sources, and for what amount? (SEC Treasurers can help you identify other sources of funding.)

Yes we are pursing other sources of funding opportunities. So far we have received funding from Sustainable SFU, purpose capital and One Earth as this is a conjoined event with a committee composed of city employees, SFU and UBC students. We are waiting on additional funding from 350.org to cover flight expenses for our guest speakers coming from California and Toronto.
