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1. Describe your project and its purpose (approximately 200 words)?

UBC Canadian Liver Foundation (CLF) will be hosting it's second annual coffeehouse. The event will be held on November 3rd in the AMS Nest Great Hall. The purpose of this event is to showcase various performers from our campus as well as from other post-secondary schools as well. With various treats and good music, attendees are bound to have a good time. Our ultimate goal for this event is to raise money for the regional Canadian Liver Foundation.

2. Outline how your project pertains to the environment and sustainability at UBC (approximately 200 words)?

Similarly to last year, we will be purchasing food and cutlery for our event. For food, we will be purchasing from various light food places such as Aphrodite's, Green's Organic, and Whole Foods for locally grown produce. We will be serving pies, cupcakes, muffins and vegetable platters, which are all vegetarian. As well, we still have some napkins left over from our previous event so we will be continuing to use that. We will order any cutlery that we require from BSI Solution which is made from compostable corn.

In return, the SEC logo will be on the opening presentation and there will be constant reminders to compost and recycle throughout the event.

We are looking into getting sponsored from other coffee places on campus such as Great Dane and the Boulevard Coffee Roasting Co and Starbucks. If your project is approved, the SEC will reimburse you for the purchases made. You must provide the SEC with proof-of-purchase. If you have any questions regarding the Eco-Initiatives Funding, please contact SEC Treasurers. Arrangements can be made to provide students with funding before purchasing if they cannot afford to make the purchase for their project and then receive compensation. Reimbursement usually takes about 5 business days. Eco-Initiatives Grants can fund a wide variety of projects; any projects related to the environment or sustainability, and involving members of the UBC student body, will be considered. However, requests for funding for projects undertaken as part of coursework at UBC, or individual volunteer projects, must illustrate a connection to the wider student body at UBC.
