1. Describe your project and its purpose (approximately 200 words)?

Startup Weekends are weekend-long, hands-on experiences where entrepreneurs and aspiring entrepreneurs can find out if startup ideas are viable. On average, half of Startup Weekend's attendees have technical or design backgrounds, the other half have business backgrounds.

Beginning with open mic pitches on Friday, attendees bring their best ideas and inspire others to join their team. Over Saturday and Sunday teams focus on customer development, validating their ideas, practicing LEAN Startup Methodologies and building a minimal viable product. On Sunday evening teams demo their prototypes and receive valuable feedback from a panel of experts.

2. Outline how your project pertains to the environment and sustainability at UBC (approximately 200 words)?

While the purpose is not to raise awareness about the environment or sustainability, we are trying to keep our event as sustainable as possible. We will be serving food during the 3 days so the money would be used to subsidize the cost. We are looking into getting food from Peqish. They have various sustainable practices in place including the following:

- The packaging is 100% biodegradable made from paper and the clear window is made from plant-based cellulose!
- All the meat is from local farms
- The food can be served on a platter (reducing plastic for dinner meals!)

As well, the advertisement for the event will be done online via Facebook and emails – reducing the use of posters.

3. How will you document the successes and difficulties of your project? In what ways do you foresee this documentation aiding other SEC Eco-Initiatives (approximately 200 words)?

To document the successes and difficulties of our project, we will forward you our purchase from Peqish.
