Earth to Paris: Sending Our Climate Message is an hour-long event being organized by UBCC350 with an expected audience of about 100 + people, primarily UBC students. Our goal is to amplify the youth voice in the global climate discussions by bringing together young passionate leaders to speak to the need for strong climate action locally, nationally and globally.

The UBC Board of Governors is scheduled to make a decision regarding divestment just a few days after this event, so we are also taking the opportunity to highlight the Divest UBC campaign as an important local action under the slogan "Commit globally; Divest locally! We would like to use the global attention on the climate conference to channel student's energy and passion for change to the UBC's divestment campaign. We truly believe that divestment of UBC's Endowment fund from fossil fuels is tangible and impactful in the global climate movement.

This year UBCC350 is really attempting to step up our social media presence so we can rely more on internet circles opposed to paper in spreading our event. That being said we still see the value in campus posters and would like to allocate funds to printing materials on recycled paper. We will also be doing our best to re-use fabric in creating our banner.

How to Submit the Funding Application

Completed forms can be emailed to sec.ubc@gmail.com (preferred) or dropped off at our office, Room 2106 of in the AMS Student Nest, during office hours¹. You are also welcome (but not required) to attend our weekly meetings² to present your project idea to our group, though we would appreciate an email informing us of this intent at least 48 hours ahead of time. The executive team and other active members of SEC would be happy to help you formulate your project as well as assist with its development and applications for funding.

If your funding application is approved, the Student Environment Centre will reimburse you for the specified purchases and expenses. You will then be referred to our Treasurer, whom you must provide with receipts and/or proof-purchases. Reimbursement usually takes about 5 business days. In the event that a student is unable to make the necessary purchase(s) to start their project, arrangements for advance funding can be made.

A Note about Eco-Initiatives Grants

Eco-Initiatives Grants can be used to fund a wide variety of projects: any projects related to the environment or sustainability, and involving members of the UBC student body, will be considered. However, funding requests for projects undertaken as part of coursework at UBC, or individual volunteer projects, must illustrate a connection to the wider student body.
